



To Piedmont Park Area Residents and Businesses:

Music Midtown will be held Saturday, September 14th and Sunday, September 15th, 2019 in Piedmont Park. We would like to inform you of a few details in an effort to mitigate and minimize any inconvenience caused by the music festival.

- The official event hours are Saturday, September 14th from 12:00pm - 11:00pm, and Sunday, September 15th from 12:00pm - 10:00pm.
- There will be amplified sound during sound checks and performances. Sound checks begin Friday, September 13th from 5:00pm - 9:00pm, and again prior to performances on Saturday and Sunday, beginning at 9:00am.
- The festival website and app will include a neighborhood information section, to include day-by-day maps detailing traffic patterns and bicycle and pedestrian park access points throughout setup. Onsite signage and daily security team briefings will also support clearer access information this year.
- This year's traffic plan was developed in conjunction with the Office of Planning and DPW, and includes a diagonal crossing at Monroe and 10th to safely cross pedestrians and bikes at this already crowded intersection. See reverse for more information. Traffic detail will also be included on www.musicmidtown.com and the Music Midtown app within the Resident section.
- Music Midtown will issue dash passes for resident vehicles to allow quicker access into Resident Access Only streets. Dash passes may be obtained during the following times in front of the 12th Street Box Office at the Piedmont Park Community Center (next to the 12th Street entrance and Willy's Mexicana Grill, 1071 Piedmont Ave)
 - Thursday, September 12th from 12pm - 7pm
 - Friday, September 13th from 12pm - 7pm
 - Saturday, September 14th from 9am - 12pm
 - Residents impacted by the Resident Access Only streets must bring (1) a valid ID, and (2) a July or August utility bill OR a recent lease agreement to confirm current residency
 - There will be a Resident-Only queue separate from the standard ticketing lines at the box office
 - Note: the dash passes DO NOT provide parking; they merely grant entry through police barricades on Resident Access Only streets. All standard parking laws still apply, and during special events illegal parking fines increase to \$75 for parking in a residential parking area without a city-issued residential parking permit.
- If you are unable to obtain a dash pass and need to access a Resident Access Only street during the two event days:
 - (1) identify yourself as a resident to the traffic officer at the barricade
 - (2) present your ID with your residential address (and a utility bill if your address is not up to date on your ID) to the traffic officer upon request
- Music Midtown issued complimentary resident tickets directly to the Midtown Neighbors; Association, and will not be distributing complimentary tickets to any individuals.

- Should there be a large accumulation of attendee-related trash on your property (keep in mind most of the clean-up occurs overnight and in the morning each event day), please call Whitten Waste Management to report the exact location of the debris: 770-439-7380.
 - The clean up crew will begin working each day of the event from the outside (in the neighborhood) to the inside (within the park). Clean up crews may be cleaning in the streets overnight until roughly 3am, returning at daylight for anything previously unseen
- Music Midtown is placing portable toilets outside of the gated festival area in an effort to mitigate incidents of public urination. Public toilets will be placed at the Midtown and Arts Center MARTA Stations, Monroe Drive near the Grady Stadium ticket booths, and Charles Allen Drive on the Grady High School side of the street.

We are grateful for your patience during this time and are looking forward to a great event.

 - South Sidewalk on 10th Street
 - All entrance access north of 12th Street and Lake Clara Meer remain unchanged.
